## Parents Association Movie Night Fundraiser



This Friday, 23rd February sees the return of the PA Movie Night in Holy Cross. It is always a very enjoyable night for the children as well as providing parents with a bit of quiet time on a Friday evening!

**The Movie Night will run from 6pm-8pm in the school.** The children will be divided into different groups based on their class to watch a movie with their friends.



To avoid big queues at the front door we will use the same entrance system as last year where children can enter with their parents via the two white doors to the senior corridor at the front of the school (to the right of the blue porch) and parents can then pay and leave via the blue porch. Children can be collected in the front yard at 8pm.

The children can bring a treat along for themselves but we would ask that they do not come along with items for sharing and keep the amount of treats at a "sensible" level! Bringing along a bottle of water would also be a good idea. The children do not have to wear the school uniform on the night but please be mindful of wearing clothes that won't cause them to overheat.



The cost on the night will be €10 for one child, €15 for two or €20 for three or more. The staff car park will be open on the night as will the gate to the County Council car park at the rear of the school.

## Camogie & Hurling Training

It is that time of the year again when we can look forward to seeing the girls and boys of Holy Cross representing their school on the Hurling and Camogie pitches of Dublin. Matches for all teams will begin after the Easter holidays. In advance of competitive matches, our dedicated team of teachers have arranged for some training to take place for the four weeks leading up to the Easter break. This year, as a trial, training sessions will take place in the mornings, before school. The first morning training will take place NEXT WEEK, Tuesday 27<sup>th</sup> February. Any child from Rang 3 to Rang 6 who would like to come along can meet the teachers in the front yard at 8:15am. If any child has their own hurley and helmet at home they can bring that along with them but we have plenty of spares in the school already. After Easter, matches will take place in the afternoon for all teams as usual.
