








Smart Tech Usage in Holy Cross

Our fantastic Student Council, working with Ms. Faulkner's Rang 5, have been working on gathering some data on smartphone usage in Holy Cross. They were interested due to the recent media coverage regarding Social Media laws in Australia being discussed in Ireland and other European countries. What they have discovered is very interesting - please see below!



The Student Council wanted to compare the % of students in Holy Cross with smartphones against the national average.

We found that we are way below the national average! By less than half!

We surveyed 3rd to 6th class and found:

- 21% pupils have a smart phone
- 2% have "dumb" phones (Nokia etc)
- 25% have smart watches that allow kids to call/ text their parents

We're delighted with these results and hope that this is one area that we can stay below average!
